The position is full-time, fiscal year (12-month), benefits-eligible appointment with no tenure implications. This position is 100% research. Anticipated start date is April 2024.

Candidates who are non-US citizens will need to be eligible for a J-1 Scholar visa status for the duration of the postdoctoral period. The CSC does not support H1B visa status.

Minimum Qualifications include:

- 1. Must have earned a Ph.D. (within the last 5 years or anticipated by the beginning of the appointment) in psychology, animal behavior, behavioral ecology, or related discipline.
- 2. Demonstrated commitment to working with faculty, staff, students, and communities to advance the principles of the ASU Charter.

Desirable Qualifications:

- 1. Experience working with dogs and/or other canid species.
- 2. Experience training and/or supervising laboratory personnel.
- 3. Familiarity with statistical computing methods and tools.
- 4. Candidates with strong statistical and computer programming skills, experience with social behavior in mammals or insects, and knowledge of Med-PC V are particularly competitive.
