

The Department of Psychology at Arizona State University invites applications for two full-time Assistant or Associate Teaching Professor positions (rank is commensurate with applicant's experience) with an anticipated start date of August 2025. The positions are full-time, benefits-eligible, career-track (i.e., non-tenure-eligible) positions renewable on an academic year basis (August 16 to May 15) contingent upon satisfactory performance, availability of resources, and the needs of the university. The successful candidates will be expected to teach four sections (likely a mix of online and in-person) per semester at the undergraduate level in support of the Neuroscience major and will participate in service to the university and profession as appropriate. Assigned courses will typically include one or more foundational courses (e.g., Introduction to Neuroscience, Research Methods in Neuroscience), along with one or more upper-division breadth courses in (e.g., Cognitive Neuroscience, Neuroscience of Learning and Motivation).

The Department of Psychology, which manages Arizona State's Neuroscience major, is a vibrant community that is dedicated to educational excellence and groundbreaking research. The department aims to explore and advance the understanding of the mind, brain, thinking, feeling, and behavior through innovative research, education, and community engagement. The department's mission is rooted in solving complex psychological, biological, and social challenges through cutting-edge psychological science and neuroscience, and producing first-class educational programs for our growing undergraduate student populations. The application deadline is October 31, 2024. Applications will continue to be accepted on a rolling basis for a reserve pool. Applications in the reserve pool may then be reviewed in the order in which they were received until the positions are filled. - A letter of application;
- A curriculum vitae or resume;
- Statement of teaching philosophy;
- Syllabi and course-related material (including evaluations, if available) for up to two courses you have taught;
